Ensuring Educational Stability for All Students

At **Carolina Achieve**, we are committed to providing every student with a safe, supportive, and consistent education — regardless of their housing situation. Under the **McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act**, we ensure that children and youth experiencing homelessness have full access to the same free, appropriate public education as other children.

Who Qualifies?

Children and youth may be eligible for McKinney-Vento services if they lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Living in shelters, transitional housing, or motels
 - Staying temporarily with friends or relatives due to loss of housing or economic hardship (also known as "doubling up")
 - Living in cars, parks, campgrounds, public spaces, or abandoned buildings
 - Youth who are unaccompanied (not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian)

Services We Provide

Eligible students at Carolina Achieve may receive:

- **Immediate school enrollment**, even without required documents
- **Transportation assistance** to and from school
- **Free school meals**
- **Access to school supplies and clothing**

- **Support from school counselors and social workers**
 - **Referrals to community resources** for housing, healthcare, and more
 - **Assistance with extracurricular participation** and academic support

Your Rights Under McKinney-Vento

Families and youth experiencing homelessness have the right to:

- Enroll and attend school immediately
 - Remain in their school of origin if it is in the student's best interest
 - Receive transportation to and from the school of origin
 - Participate fully in school activities and programs
